

Expectations are high and so is the level teaching, encouragement and support that each and every student receive.

This important stage in the educational journey is when students develop the skills of self-management, self-discipline, independence and responsibility in order to progress successfully into the world of work or Higher Education and as such, we have proven structures in place to help achieve these skills.

In my experience

My experience of applying to Countesthorpe Academy was a smooth and well guided process. My teachers and tutors were able to help me in writing up a strong personal statement that was able to give Countesthorpe a good sense of who I am and why I may be a good fit for the Hive community. It is important to communicate a sense of well-roundedness by highlighting a number of extracurricular activities as well as the lessons and transferable skills that can be applied to studying at Countesthorpe. A great example is how volunteering in a charity shop caused me to develop my time-management and organisational skills. After submitting my application, I promptly found out whether I had an interview. The interview process was similar to a friendly conversation whereby I was asked why I wanted to study the subjects I had chosen. Whilst it may seem daunting at first, I found the application process to be well supported by both my secondary school and Countesthorpe's Sixth Form

The Hive Sixth Form has a welcoming community atmosphere. As an external student I was worried that I would find it challenging to integrate with already formed friendship groups, however everyone was eager to accept me as their friend and I quickly settled in. The staff at Countesthorpe were just as welcoming as the students; I find my teachers to be engaging and enthusiastic members of our Sixth Form community who are always open to providing further support. I believe that having such confident and well-prepared teachers made bridging the gap between GCSE's and A-Level's so much more manageable. Part of this step up when studying your A Levels is the sudden independence you are given, you are treated like an adult by staff and therefore they expect you to learn to balance your work with things you do outside of school. During study periods the Sixth Form have three key study rooms: our amazing Hive Centre which is perfect for social studying, next door is the Hive Fuel where you can buy drinks, snacks and lunch during the day and then there is the Sixth Form quiet study room in our brand-new building. These spaces provide a variety of different environments in order to achieve the perfect balance between socialising with friends and getting your head down to work.

Future and how the academy is helping

Countesthorpe encourages all Sixth Form students to start considering their future early in order to make the right decisions later down the line. Mrs Challinor is excellent at providing resources that will help you to develop your personal statement and prepare you for UCAS applications. During year twelve we were told to make the most of virtual work experience opportunities and access programs which provide support when applying to Russell Group universities. However, if you don't think you want to go to university, I have found Countesthorpe to be supportive of all routes including planning gap years, applying for jobs and apprenticeships. Tutors are also a great support network when considering your next steps as they are able to help advise you on your personal statements and discuss what options are available to you. This year there are bi-weekly mentoring sessions during registration where you are given the opportunity to review your applications and future plans with your tutor. Another new addition to this year is the SCAR programme which has led me to explore and become the master of one topic related to what I want to do in the future. This gives everyone a supercurricular activity that demonstrates our enthusiasm towards our course and will make us unique applicants when applying for jobs as well as higher education. The Hive Sixth Form is well equipped to guide all students when making daunting life choices and encourage us to reach our potential. I am confident that I have the skills and knowledge to prepare me for my future.

High performance, going further

Students are challenged and encouraged to recognise and realise their potential in a range of different areas, whether it be academic, sporting, artistic or vocational achievement. Success is celebrated regardless of direction.

We support our academic high achieving students through 'The Elephant Group Programme' whose underlying principle is that of high expectation and aspiration. Those who demonstrate high academic potential, and the will to succeed are supported through a range of challenging and focused learning activities and provided with inspirational extra-curricular activities ranging from university visits to Oxbridge conferences and summer schools at Russell Group Universities, to mock entrance exams and interviews. Personalised intervention opportunities ensure that we stretch and extend our students to deepen their learning and thinking. We understand that high achievement is not just confined to the classroom, and can be defined as academic, able and talented and we tailor our support according the students' skills.

What a day in the HIVE looks like...

We are proud of the fact that our Sixth Form students are taught by exceptional staff whose passion for their subject is second to none. Subject options are taught for 9 hours per fortnight with additional sessions for tutorial activities with your form group.

Each day is broken down into five, one hour lessons, and your subject lessons are taught over a two week timetable. Each hourly lesson has been carefully planned, and is immensely focused.

What we offer

Year 12 students will opt for 3 A Level subjects which will be studied over two years.

In addition to this, ALL students will undertake a core programme of study which includes participation in the tutorial programme and enrichment options. Students may also opt to study the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ).

Entry requirements

In order to study A Levels at the Sixth Form students must:


Have five GCSEs (or more) at Grade 5 (Merit in BTEC subjects) or above, including at least a Grade 4 in English and Maths. We would also ask that students would ideally have at least a level 5 in the subject area they wanted to study, if they have previously studies their chosen subject. There are additional entry requirements for the following subjects:

- Psychology A Level 5 in Maths and 5 in Biology GCSE
- Maths and Further Maths A Level 6 in Maths GCSE
- Biology, Chemistry, Physics A Level 6 in the chosen Science specialism

The EPQ is a research-based qualification that supports the skills that are so important in Higher Education and in the work of work. Included in the EPQ are visits to University Libraries and students will receive relevant advice from supervisors who provide guidance and support.

Subject availability is subject to student uptake.

Careers advice

Every student will benefit from a dedicated careers advice and guidance offer that provides information, for a number of pathways. These include UCAS university applications and applying to college places or apprenticeships schemes including Degree Apprenticeships.

Our careers team also co-ordinate careers days, visiting speakers and industry presentations, university taster days and are always available to book an interview with for one-to-one advice. Tutorial sessions are developed to meet your personal, social, professional and financial needs includes guidance on student finance, sponsorships and bursaries. The programme is developed to provide support for your next steps applications, whether this is onwards towards University or on to an Apprenticeship. All of your career needs can be met through this programme Additional support for your ongoing success can be sought from our careers and guidance teacher. Our wealth of knowledge and contacts throughout various industries means that whatever your ambitions are we can support you.

Sixth Form students have exclusive access the Hive, which comprises of a variety of study areas, a social area and a dedicated Fuel Bar refreshment and dining area. The Hive Study Area provides our students with modern facilities in a spacious, vibrant and supportive environment.

The Library

Rich in resources and learning technologies the well-stocked contemporary Library within the main body of the Academy is at the heart of independent learning.

Hive Centre

The Hive Centre has an open plan area for group study, plus quite individual space for personal study and reading, as well as outstanding internet and digital access throughout.

Hive Study

A space for focussed independent study where students can find quiet space to allow them to focus on their studies.

Hive Fuel

The Hive Fuel Bar is a social area giving students a chance to relax and catch up with friends in an area with comfortable seating, personal lockers and tables where students can eat or get on with group work.

Within the Academy, sixth form students have access to first class science laboratories, art studios, music and rehearsal rooms, sports and theatre, and enviable IT and Digital software and resources. The new building on site is the location for the Hive Study Centre and the new Activity Studio.

Motivational tutoring

Excellent study skill support

For transition to Sixth form to be successful you will need enhanced study skills. Regular opportunities are on offer at different points in the year to help you in organising your work, improving your revision techniques or independent research skills. Your tutor will also provide guidance as part of our tutor programme and provide you with individual support.







Enrichment opportunities

Additional to the breadth of academic subject choices we offer, you'll be encouraged to select from a wide range of enrichment opportunities. Not only will you enjoy it, but you will develop a whole range of important life skills, be it your interpersonal, organisational or leadership skills that improve, they will all give you that crucial advantage when it comes to being interviewed for a Higher Education place, job or apprenticeship.

We believe that providing our students with opportunities to extend their skills and qualities beyond the classroom is paramount. Involvement in enrichment programmes will enhance students wider appreciation, understanding and improvement of life skills. Throughout Sixth Form we support students to secure a community and enrichment placement that either incorporates elements of their study programme or further develops their social and interpersonal skills.

They may also consider a placement that will support their UCAS application such as helping at a local primary school to support a teaching application or volunteering at a nursing home in order to gain valuable experience in a 'caring' profession. Students are currently participating in Mentoring Schemes, Sports Leaders, Reading Club, charities committees and helping to organise their Year 13 prom and Year Book. Many of our Sixth Form students become part of our award winning "Let's Talk" mental health support programme. The emphasis on looking after our own well being and passing on our support to others is one of the fundamental priorities of staff and students at Hive Sixth Form. There are also many additional Student Ambassador and Leadership roles available. In addition, all Year 12 students will participate in a week long work experience placement at the end of Year 12.

Sporting opportunities

The vibrant and enthusiastic Physical Education department run numerous Academy clubs and teams, with links with numerous organisations, affiliated youth groups and clubs in the wider community. Our impressive facilities include: Fitness Suite; Gym; multi-purpose Sports Hall; Playing Fields; Tennis Courts; Activity Studio and Drama workshops. These facilities are available for all students regardless of the subjects they choose to study.











We have many transport options for our students, including:

- Safe walking routes from Countesthorpe and Blaby
- Cycle sheds for students who wish to cycle
- Bike parking for students who wish to ride a motorcycle or scooter
- Public transport with the Arriva 85 bus picking up and dropping off right outside our campus
- Private bus services provided by a number of bus companies

For students coming to us from Thomas Estley Community College or Brockington College, and for all students living in the villages of Broughton Astley, Frolesworth, Lutterworth, Cosby, Whetstone, Enderby and the surrounding area we run an exclusive Sixth Form Minibus service.

For those of you learning to drive, we have a limited number of parking spaces available to Sixth Form students.
