

# Summer Transition Work

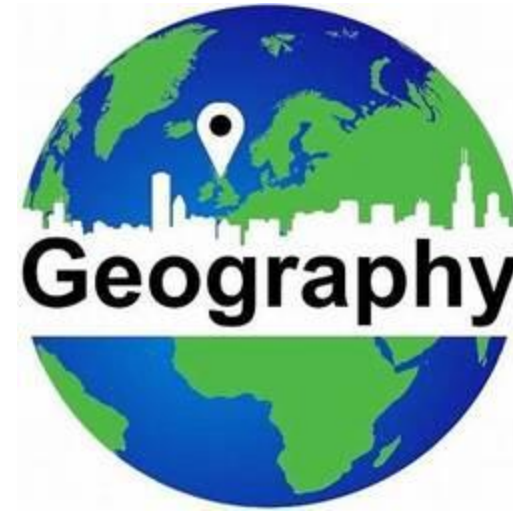
These tasks will help you to get ready for the demands of A-Level Geography, with the work done feeding directly into your classwork once you start your course.

Your research will be recorded on a table.

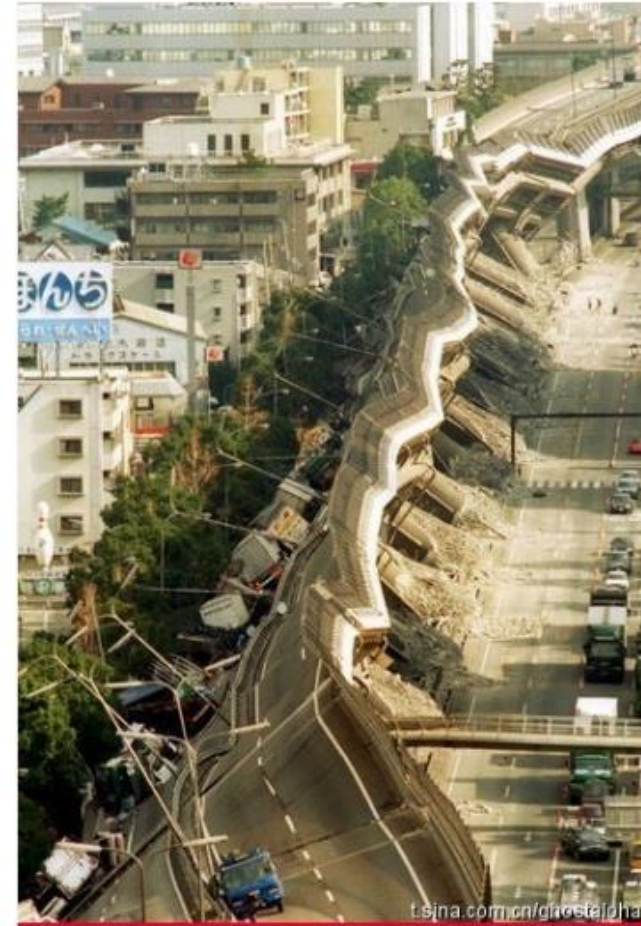
