



In my experience

A student perspective Isabelle D

My experience of applying to Countesthorpe Academy was a smooth and well guided process. My teachers and tutors were able to help me in writing up a strong personal statement that was able to give Countesthorpe a good sense of who I am and why I may be a good fit for the Hive community. It is important to communicate a sense of well-roundedness by highlighting a number of extracurricular activities as well as the lessons and transferable skills that can be applied to studying at Countesthorpe. A great example is how volunteering in a charity shop caused me to develop my time-management and organisational skills. After submitting my application, I promptly found out whether I had an interview. The interview process was similar to a friendly conversation whereby I was asked why I wanted to study the subjects I had chosen. Whilst it may seem daunting at first, I found the application process to be well supported by both my secondary school and Countesthorpe's Sixth Form

The Hive Sixth Form has a welcoming community atmosphere. As an external student I was worried that I would find it challenging to integrate with already formed friendship groups, however everyone was eager to accept me as their friend and I quickly settled in. The staff at Countesthorpe were just as welcoming as the students; I find my teachers to be engaging and enthusiastic members of our Sixth Form community who are always open to providing further support. I believe that having such confident and well-prepared teachers made bridging the gap between GCSE's and A-Level's so much more manageable. Part of this step up when studying your A Levels is the sudden independence you are given, you are treated like an adult by staff and therefore they expect you to learn to balance your work with things you do outside of school. During study periods the Sixth Form have three key study rooms: our amazing Hive Centre which is perfect for social studying, next door is the Hive Fuel where you can buy drinks, snacks and lunch during the day and then there is the Sixth Form quiet study room in our brand-new building. These spaces provide a variety of different environments in order to achieve the perfect balance between socialising with friends and getting your head down to work.

Future and how the academy is helping

Countesthorpe encourages all Sixth Form students to start considering their future early in order to make the right decisions later down the line. Mrs Challinor is excellent at providing resources that will help you to develop your personal statement and prepare you for UCAS applications. During year twelve we were told to make the most of virtual work experience opportunities and access programs which provide support when applying to Russell Group universities. However, if you don't think you want to go to university, I have found Countesthorpe to be supportive of all routes including planning gap years, applying for jobs and apprenticeships. Tutors are also a great support network when considering your next steps as they are able to help advise you on your personal statements and discuss what options are available to you. This year there are bi-weekly mentoring sessions during registration where you are given the opportunity to review your applications and future plans with your tutor. Another new addition to this year is the SCAR programme which has led me to explore and become the master of one topic related to what I want to do in the future. This gives everyone a supercurricular activity that demonstrates our enthusiasm towards our course and will make us unique applicants when applying for jobs as well as higher education. The Hive Sixth Form is well equipped to guide all students when making daunting life choices and encourage us to reach our potential. I am confident that I have the skills and knowledge to prepare me for my future.

What we offe

Year 12 students will opt for 3 subjects which will be studied over two years.

In addition to this, ALL students will undertake a core programme of study which includes participation in the tutorial programme and enrichment options. Students may also opt to study the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ).

Entry requirements

In order to study A Levels at the Sixth Form students must:


Achieve 5 GCSE grade 4 and above (or Merit BTEC L2) alongside the subject specific qualifications. Students must also have achieved either or both GCSE Maths and English (Language preferably) at grade 4. Some courses require additional entry requirements and the detail of these can be found on our website.

- Psychology A Level 4 in GCSE Maths and 5 in a GCSE Science
- Maths A Level 6 in GCSE Maths
- Further Maths A Level 7 in GCSE Maths
- Biology A Level 6 in GCSE Biology (5 in GCSE Maths is recommended)
- Chemistry A Level x2 grade 6 in GCSE Science inc Chemistry (5 in GCSE Maths is recommended)
- Physics A Level x2 grade 6 in GCSE Science inc Physics and 6 in GCSE Maths

Included in the EPQ are visits to University Libraries and students will receive relevant advice from supervisors who provide guidance and support.

Tutorial sessions are developed to meet your personal, social, professional and financial needs includes guidance on student finance, sponsorships and bursaries. The programme is developed to provide support for your next steps applications, whether this is onwards towards University or on to an Apprenticeship. All of your career needs can be met through this programme Additional support for your ongoing success can be sought from our careers and guidance teacher. After finishing my A Levels at Hive Sixth Form, I joined Jaguar Land Rover as part of their Applied Professional **Engineering Degree Apprenticeship programme and** now have the privilege of supporting the development of world class automotive products. I chose this alternate pathway as it allows me to combine hands-on experience and academic learning simultaneously.

My journey into engineering was strongly shaped by the experiences and support I received at Hive Sixth Form. The emphasis on career preparation gave me the confidence to explore alternative pathways beyond traditional university routes, ultimately leading me to the degree apprenticeship route. The high quality of teaching at Hive allowed me to seamlessly transition into university-level study, having studied Maths, Business Studies and Physics.

The guidance and coaching that I received during my time at Hive was instrumental in helping me identify and secure a role that aligned with both my academic interests and long-term career aspirations. From tailored UCAS, interview and apprenticeship support to enrichment opportunities that developed my leadership and teamwork skills, Hive Sixth Form equipped me with the skills and tools I needed to succeed in a professional engineering environment.

From the very start of my time at Hive Sixth Form, I always felt fully supported in my ambition, which was to apply to the University of Cambridge to study Science.

Both the Head of Sixth Form and my subject tutors took a genuine interest in my goals and provided guidance throughout the entire process - from helping me explore different course options to find the best one for me and refining my personal statement, to organising mock interviews that closely mirrored the real thing. Their belief in my potential never wavered, and that encouragement made all the difference.

My subject tutors challenged me academically, stretched my thinking beyond the syllabus, and were always available to discuss ideas or give detailed feedback. Their enthusiasm and dedication gave me the confidence to aim high, and I truly believe their support was an invaluable factor in my success in receiving my offer from the University of Cambridge.

I have recently started my degree course in Biological Natural Sciences at Queen's College, Cambridge, something that was my target when joining Hive Sixth Form. I am looking forward to the amazing opportunities available to me here at Cambridge and will fondly remember my time and experience gained at the Hive.

The Library

Motivational Coaching

We are proud to provide an enhanced tutoring and mentoring programme that our Sixth Form students take part in most mornings. The Professional, Reflection and Enrichment Programme (PREP) allows for tutors to act as coach and mentor to support our young people on their journey to academic and personal success. They will have high expectations of you and will be there to support and encourage you to achieve your own aspirations and goals. They will get to know you well, and will monitor your progress and attendance.

Excellent study skill support

For transition to Sixth form to be successful you will need enhanced study skills. Regular opportunities are on offer at different points in the year to help you in organising your work, improving your revision techniques or independent research skills.







Enrichment opportunities

Additional to the breadth of academic subject choices we offer, you'll be encouraged to select from a wide range of enrichment opportunities.

Not only will you enjoy it, but you will develop a whole range of important life skills, be it your interpersonal, organisational or leadership skills that improve, they will all give you that crucial advantage when it comes to being interviewed for a Higher Education place, job or apprenticeship.

We believe that providing our students with opportunities to extend their skills and qualities beyond the classroom is paramount. Involvement in enrichment programmes will enhance students wider appreciation, understanding and improvement of life skills. Throughout Sixth Form we support students to secure a community and enrichment placement that either incorporates elements of their study programme or further develops their social and interpersonal skills.

They may also consider a placement that will support their UCAS application such as helping at a local primary school to support a teaching application or volunteering at a nursing home in order to gain valuable experience in a 'caring' profession. Students are currently participating in Mentoring Schemes, Sports Leaders, Reading Club, charities committees and helping to organise their Year 13 prom and Year Book. Many of our Sixth Form students become part of our award winning "Let's Talk" mental health support programme. The emphasis on looking after our own well being and passing on our support to others is one of the fundamental priorities of staff and students at Hive Sixth Form. There are also many additional Student Ambassador and Leadership roles available. In addition, all Year 12 students will participate in a work experience placement at the end of Year 12.

Sporting opportunities

The vibrant and enthusiastic Physical Education department run numerous Academy clubs and teams, with links with numerous organisations, affiliated youth groups and clubs in the wider community. Our impressive facilities include: Fitness Suite; Gym; multi-purpose Sports Hall; Playing Fields; Tennis Courts; Activity Studio and Drama workshops. These facilities are available for all students regardless of the subjects they choose to study.











We have many transport options for our students, including:

- Safe walking routes from Countesthorpe and Blaby
- Cycle sheds for students who wish to cycle
- Bike parking for students who wish to ride a motorcycle or scooter
- Public transport with the Arriva 85 bus picking up and dropping off right outside our campus
- Private bus services provided by a number of bus companies

For students living in the villages of Broughton Astley, Frolesworth, Lutterworth, Cosby, Whetstone, Enderby and the surrounding area we run an exclusive Sixth Form Minibus service.

For those of you learning to drive, we have a limited number of parking spaces available to Sixth Form students.


